

Rules of Requirements for English Proficiency of EMI Course

Instructors at I-Shou University

Adopted by the University Administration Council on May 18, 2022, and promulgated with the consent from the President dated on May 30, 2022

- I. The Rules of Requirements for English Proficiency of EMI Course Instructors at I-Shou University (hereinafter referred to as “the Rules”) are made by I-Shou University (hereinafter referred to as “the University”) to keep promoting and implementing bilingual education, hone faculty members' EMI skills, and echo the Program on Bilingual Education for Students in College (the BEST Program) of the Ministry of Education.
- II. Faculty members who meet one of the following requirements are considered reaching the C1 level under the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR):
 1. Possessing a bachelor’s degree or higher (or academic credentials at an equivalent level) conferred in an English speaking country;
 2. Fulfilling one of the following English proficiency requirements:
 - a. GEPT: Second stage of Advanced Level
 - b. TOEFL: PBT/ITP: 560; IBT: 83 (Speaking: 25)
 - c. TOEIC: 880; NEW TOEIC: 945 (Listening: 490; Reading: 455); Speaking: 180
 - d. IELTS: 6.5 (Speaking: 7)
 - e. FLPT: Reading and Listening: 240; Speaking: S-3
 - f. Cam. Main Suite: CAE (Speaking: 180)
 - g. Linguaskill: Reading and Listening: 180+; Speaking: 180
 - h. GET: Reading and Listening: C1; Speaking: C1
 3. Having taken the EMI training courses offered by the University (Course 1+3 or Course 2+3), earned the training certificate, and passed the evaluation made by the EMI specialist hired by the University.
- III. Matters not mentioned herein, if any, shall be subject to the applicable regulations and rules of the University.
- IV. The Rules become effective on the third day of promulgation after being adopted by the University Administration Council and ratified by the President.

Note: In the event of any disputes or misunderstanding as to the interpretation of the language or terms of the Rules, the Chinese language version shall prevail.
